Report on the ISE sponsored event, the Sixth Regional Symposium on Electrochemistry - South East Europe (RSE-SEE6, 11-15 June 2017, Balatonkenese, Hungary).

Following five successful symposia in Croatia, Serbia, Romania, Slovenia and Bulgaria, the Sixth Regional Symposium on Electrochemistry – South East Europe (RSE–SEE6) was hosted by Hungary in June 2017, supported by the electrochemical societies of the region, represented by 17 countries.

Following the traditions of the RSE-SEE series of crossing the regional borders, a common platform was created for scientists and experts from regional and international research and industrial institutions with the aim of sharing knowledge, ideas, and achievements. In general, the organizers wanted to provide the background, a friendly atmosphere of the personal contacts and fruitful discussions on the latest developments in electrochemical science and technology. The organized technical exhibition was flavoured by scientific talks delivered by the manufacturers. There were more then 100 participants the overwhelming majority of whose were from South-East Europe; the scientific program consisted of 4 plenary (held by Drs Mayrhofer, Eliaz, Gyenge, and Inzelt), 7 keynote lectures (held by Drs Ciglenečki-Jušić, Hodník, Lović, Péter, Ungureanu, Vesztergom, and Vladikova), 53 and 39 oral and poster presentations, respectively. The written version of selected talks will appear in a special issue of the J. Electrochemical Science and Engineering in 2018.

On behalf of the organizers I would like to acknowledge with gratitude the financial support of the International Society of Electrochemistry which enabled to support the participation of one Romanian and one Serbian distinguished colleague. Both of them presented keynote lectures and were awarded with a grant covering their conference registration fees.
